



Treating Traumatic Loss Related PTSD in Military Service Members and Veterans

Course Description

Target Audience: Mental health providers who treat military personnel and veterans with PTSD

Instructional Level: Advanced

The purpose of this course is to educate mental health professionals about the role that traumatic loss plays in the phenomenology and treatment of PTSD in military service members and veterans. The course will discuss common traumatic loss experiences for military populations and how to assess for traumatic loss. This course will also provide mental health professionals with best practices for working with patients with traumatic loss when utilizing evidence-based trauma-focused treatment for PTSD.

Course Objectives:

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- 1) Define traumatic loss and describe the impact of traumatic loss in service members and veterans with PTSD.
- 2) Assess for and identify individuals with traumatic loss and associated complicated grief reactions.
- 3) Apply best practices to their work with service members and veterans with traumatic loss related PTSD utilizing Cognitive Processing Therapy or Prolonged Exposure.

Vanessa M. Jacoby, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor and a Licensed Clinical Psychologist within the Division of Behavioral Medicine and the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. Dr. Jacoby provides clinical services to active duty service members and their families for the STRONG STAR Consortium and the Consortium to Alleviate PTSD (CAP). Her research interests are in the developmental trajectory, and treatment, of PTSD and other trauma-related disorders. She specializes in Cognitive Processing Therapy for PTSD and Prolonged Exposure for PTSD. Additionally, Dr. Jacoby has worked with trauma-exposed children and whole families utilizing Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) and has experience in incorporating family members into evidence-based treatments for PTSD.
